

Our Vision: \$100 million invested by 2030

Minority and women-owned firms comprise less than 10% of the asset management industry and control just under 1% of the \$70 trillion in U.S. assets. BII's cohort-based accelerator program addresses this disparity by offering a fund design curriculum, facilitated sessions with peer impact funds, and expert coaching to take emerging impact funds from their investment thesis to a completed fund design within 4-6 months. Our cohorts help participants develop financial acumen and engage stakeholders to structure, raise, and manage blended capital funds. We are increasing the number of diverse-led funds and enhancing financing support for entrepreneurs of color.
